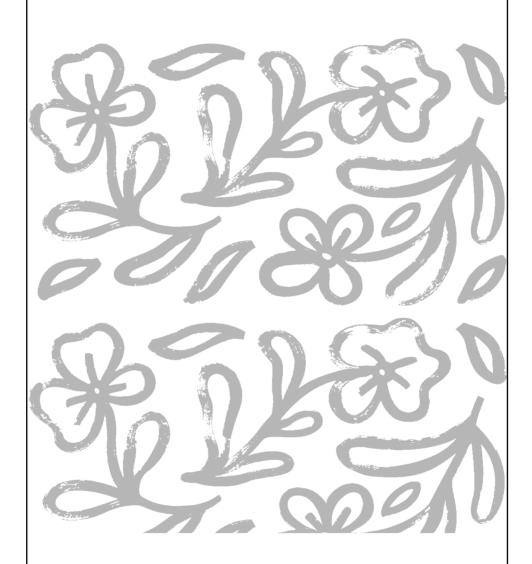

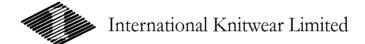

Directors' Report

The Board of Directors of International Knitwear Limited (INKL) is pleased to present the company's unaudited financial statements for the half year ended December 31, 2024.

PROFIT AND LOSS ANALYSIS

In the reviewed period, the company's net sales revenue has increased by 41.28% to Rs. 572.37 million compared to the previous year's Rs. 405.12. The company recorded a gross profit of Rs. 38.39 million during the period under review against Rs. 67.78million showing a decrease of Rs.29.39 million which is43.36% as compared to the previous year. Earnings per share (EPS) for the period were Rs. 1.13 compared to Rs. 2.43 for the corresponding period.

REVIEW OF OPERATION

The company has achieved a notable improvement in sales volume for both Export and Local markets during this period compared to last year (SPLY). Export sales increased from Rs. 257.84 million to Rs. 348.91 million, reflecting a growth of Rs. 91.06 million or 35.31%. Similarly, Local sales rose from Rs. 147.27 million to Rs. 223.46 million, an increase of Rs. 76.18 million or 51.73%. This growth in turnover can be attributed to higher product prices and expanded capacity in the value-added segment.

This commendable sales performance results from timely strategic actions by the management and targeted customer outreach efforts. However, despite the increase in sales, profit margins have come under pressure due to rising costs. A significant factor was the decision to honour our commitment to an export buyer by shipping their order via air, which resulted in substantial freight and related costs amounting to Rs. 21.30 million, negatively affecting overall profitability.

The Company's investment portfolio is expected to contribute positively to profitability. Other income is mainly comprised of dividends from equity investments.

FUTURE OUTLOOK

While exports are rising, margins of textile companies involved in the export of goods remain subdued due to the high cost of production. Interest costs and energy prices in Pakistan remain higher than in competitor countries which are pressuring margins.

To address escalating energy costs, the company has successfully launched a 100 KW rooftop solar power project and an additional 150 KW rooftop system is in the final stages of implementation anticipated to be operational by February FY25. This strategic initiative is designed to lessen reliance on expensive traditional energy sources and highlights the company's dedication to sustainability.

The management expects the sales revenue to grow during the year ending June 30, 2025, and the liquidity position will further strengthen to run the operations of the Company sustainably. Going forward, we remain committed to improving our operations, to be more innovative, efficient and profitable to deliver sustainable returns to our shareholders.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REVIEW REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF INTERNATIONAL KNITWEAR LIMITED REPORT ON REVIEW OF INTERIM FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Introduction

We have reviewed the accompanying condensed interim statement of financial position of **International Knitwear Limited** as at December 31, 2024 and the related condensed interim statement of profit or loss, condensed interim statement of comprehensive income, condensed interim statement of changes in equity, and condensed interim statement of cash flows and notes to the financial statements for the six-month period then ended (here-in-after referred to as the "interim financial statements"). Management is responsible for the preparation and presentation of these interim financial statements in accordance with approved accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on these interim financial statements based on our review.

Scope of Review

We conducted our review in accordance with International Standard on Review Engagements 2410, "Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity." A review of interim financial statements consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with International Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Conclusion

Based on our review, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying interim financial statements are not prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with the approved accounting and reporting standards as applicable in Pakistan for interim financial reporting.

Other matter

The figures for the quarters ended December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023 in the condensed interim statement of profit or loss and condensed interim statement of comprehensive income have not been reviewed and we do not express a conclusion on them.

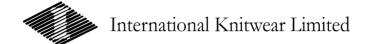

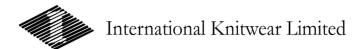

1 STATUS AND NATURE OF THE BUSINESS

2 STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

- 2.1 These condensed interim financial information of the Company for the period ended December 31, 2024 have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the International Accounting Standard 34 "Interim Financial Reporting" and provisions of the Companies Act, 2017 and directives issued by the Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SECP). Wherever the requirements differ, the provisions of the Companies Act, 2017 and the said directives have been followed.
- 2.2 These condensed interim financial information do not include all the information and disclosures required in the Annual Financial Statements, and should be read in conjunction with the Company's Annual Financial Statements for the year ended June 30, 2024.
- 2.3 The figures included in the condensed interim statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income for the quarters ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 and in the notes forming part thereof have not been reviewed by the auditors of the Company, as they have reviewed the accumulated figures for the half years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

3 MATERIAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- 3.1 The accounting policies and the methods of computation adopted in the preparation of these condensed interim financial statements are the consistent as those applied in the preparation of the audited annual financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2024.
- 3.2 Change in accounting standards, interpretations and amendments to the accounting and reporting standards

a) Standards and amendments to accounting and reporting standards which became effective during the half year ended December 31, 2024

There were certain amendments to accounting and reporting standards which became mandatory for the Company's annual accounting period which began on July 1, 2024. However, these do not have any significant impact on the Company's financial reporting and, therefore, have not been detailed in these condensed interim financial statements.

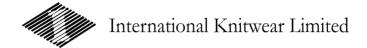
b) Standards and amendments to accounting and reporting standards that are not yet effective

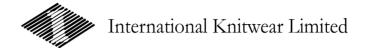
4 ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES AND JUDGEMENTS

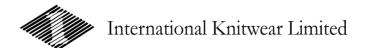
